Parish Council News

The Parish Council meeting and AGM was held on 25 May at Maple Garage at 7pm, with no residents in attendance.

The annual finance report was presented and approved for submission to the auditors.

The minutes are on the website as part of the transparence regulations but the highlights are mentioned below:

The walkabout held in last June – all the street scene items have now been completed, but other items on the general / highways list are still outstanding.

Flinton street lights are being upgraded, however we are aware of some issues during Tansterne Road which is being discussed with ERYC.

Lelley / Sproatley bridle path – Sproatley clerk has confirmed that their contractor has let them down and so are appointing a new contractor so the work can be completed.

Friends of Humbleton – the Family Fun Day is planned for 23rd July – weather permitting.

Heron's Trust – no update as yet.

Rathlin – no meeting since the last council meeting.

The next community development meeting is to be held shortly with a view to drafting the plan. Despite a request for a follow up meeting with our other stakeholders – the Recreation Club responded but were unable to attend the meeting, and the Church provided a response. No response was received from Heron's Trust.

Police reports / neighbourhood watch – one car has had its windows smashed in Humbleton but nothing since. The clerk attended the NWH event in April at Beverley Racecourse – it was good to network with other NWH groups, meeting local police officers and ERYC contacts.

Phone box – Flinton phone box has now been adopted, and the Harrison family are awaiting the paint that the clerk has ordered. The defibrillator has arrived and is at Maple Garage awaiting the painting of the phone box so we can arrange installation. The supplier of the Humbleton defibrillator has provided web training links (see later in the newsletter).

Broadband – the cabinet has been fitted in Humbleton but no details of when the upgrade will occur – and no news about Flinton.

Emergency Plan update – the annual review was completed and the clerk tasked with updating and ensuring copies sent to ERYC.

The finance report, previously circulated, was discussed and payments approved as follows: Clerk salary and expenses (£387); HMRC £75. Payments made and retrospectively approved were Bucktons £69.60 for flailing churchyard and £12.38 to The Marvell College for printing the newsletter.

No planning updates was discussed.

Big Radio 1 weekend – 2 free tickets allocated to the village – raffle to be done for interested residents.

The next meeting is 7 September 2017 at Maple Garage at 7pm.

Superfast Broadband


